The benefits of reading daily have flow on effects to expanding vocabulary, speaking and writing. It is not just me who says so, the research in this area is strong: "Parental reading to children increases the child's reading and other cognitive skills at least up to the age of 10–11. This is an early-life intervention that seems to be beneficial for the rest of their lives readtoyoungchild.pdf (education.vic.gov.au)."
